Korean Supervised Visitation Service

Since 1983, Korean American Family Services (KFAM) has been helping Korean immigrant women, children and families impacted by domestic violence.

Korean SV is offered in a comfortable facility in the heart of Koreatown. The space is equipped with alarm systems, closed circuit televisions, and separate entrances and waiting rooms to ensure safety and privacy.



Service Fees

Intake	\$50 (per parent)
Supervised Visitation	\$35—\$100 (per hour)
Supervised Exchange	\$35
Progress Letter	\$100 \$150 (less than 2-weeks notice)
Termination Letter	\$30
Subpoena	\$175 for 1st hour \$100 thereafter
No show/ Late cancellation	100% of fee

- * Sliding fee scale is available based on the parent's income.
- * Free services are available for those who meet eligibility requirements.
- * All fees must be paid prior to beginning of services.
- * Appointments **must** be cancelled with at least **24- hours notice**.

What is Supervised Visitation?

Supervised visitation is often ordered in domestic violence and contentious divorce cases where the court feels a professional monitor must be present in the best interest of the child during non-custodial parent's visit with the child.



The monitor stays with the parent and child at all times during the visit, intervenes to protect the child when necessary, and provides progress letters to the court.

KFAM's Korean supervised visitation program allows children and parents to interact freely with one another in English or Korean, and ensures that the child's safety and well-being are protected.
