# MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD & EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Dear Friends,

It is with great pleasure that KAFSC releases our 2010 Annual Report. KAFSC was founded in 1983 by Korean immigrant women inspired by the pioneering work of Dr. Tae Young Lee, Korea's first female attorney and a strong advocate of the rights of women and children, to help struggling immigrant families. Since then, KAFSC's work has grown to encompass a broad range of family-centered, culturally-responsive services that promote mental and emotional well-being, healthy relationships, and improved quality of life for those in need.

Last year was a period of renewed energy and commitment to our core services. With the economic recession creating stress and instability for so many Korean families in Los Angeles, we dedicated wholeheartedly to addressing mental health, family violence, and family support services to our clients. We hosted the First Community Mental Health Symposium for Korean Americans in Southern California titled "Mental Health & Koreans: Developing a Community Voice." We gathered 180 mental health professionals, faith and community leaders, consumers, and family members to identify needs and discuss ways to improve and expand services to our community. Through a grant from the US Department of Justice, we launched our "Happy Children Come from Healthy Families" (건강한 가정이 행복한 아이를 만듭니다) campaign to raise awareness on the life-long, harmful effects that family violence has on children. We assisted more children and families than ever before through our Child Care Food Programs and Food Stamps Enrollment assistance program. Overall, we served over 7,000 clients in 2010.

Through the ebb and flow of organizational development and growth over nearly three decades of service, what has remained constant is KAFSC's driving vision—a safe, healthy community where children, youth, and families thrive and meet the challenges of life with resilience, strength, and hope. 2010 was a pivotal time of laying foundation towards that vision. We recently celebrated the opening of our Benjamin Hong Center for Women & Children and in January 2012 will be launching our new LA County Mental Health program for those struggling with mental distress. As KAFSC expands to meet the needs of our community, we look back gratefully to those who have supported us and provided the foundation upon which we can grow.

KAFSC's growth has been possible only with your generous support and shared commitment by corporate, government, foundation, and individual supporters for the betterment of our community. Your steadfast partnership has been an intrinsic part of KAFSC's growth into the community's premier family resource center and gateway to services that have been building up Korean American families for over 28 years. We are truly thankful.

Since its inception in 1983, KAFSC has been providing quality, culturally-responsive, and holistic services that speak directly to the challenges among Korean American families undergoing trauma or adaptation and acculturation stresses. KAFSC is the community's premier family resource center and gateway to mental health, family violence, and support services for underserved immigrant families. We provide crisis help as well as prevention and early intervention services that strengthen family units and individuals so they can successfully meet life challenges and lead healthy lives. Our dedicated, skilled team of 14 staff and 7 year-round volunteers serve over 7,000 children and adults annually. Our goal is to help build a community where children and adults are safe from violence, where parents are empowered to nurture healthy relationships and healthy development of their children, and distressed individuals find recovery, hope and wellness.

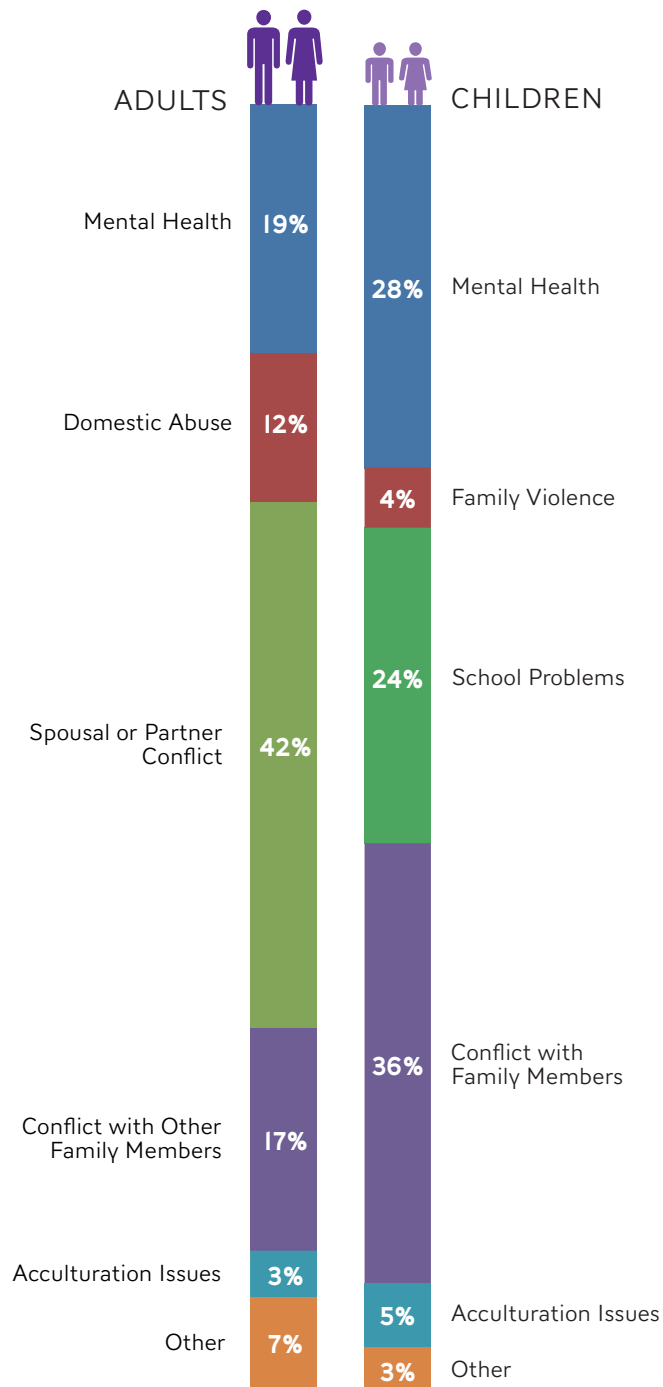

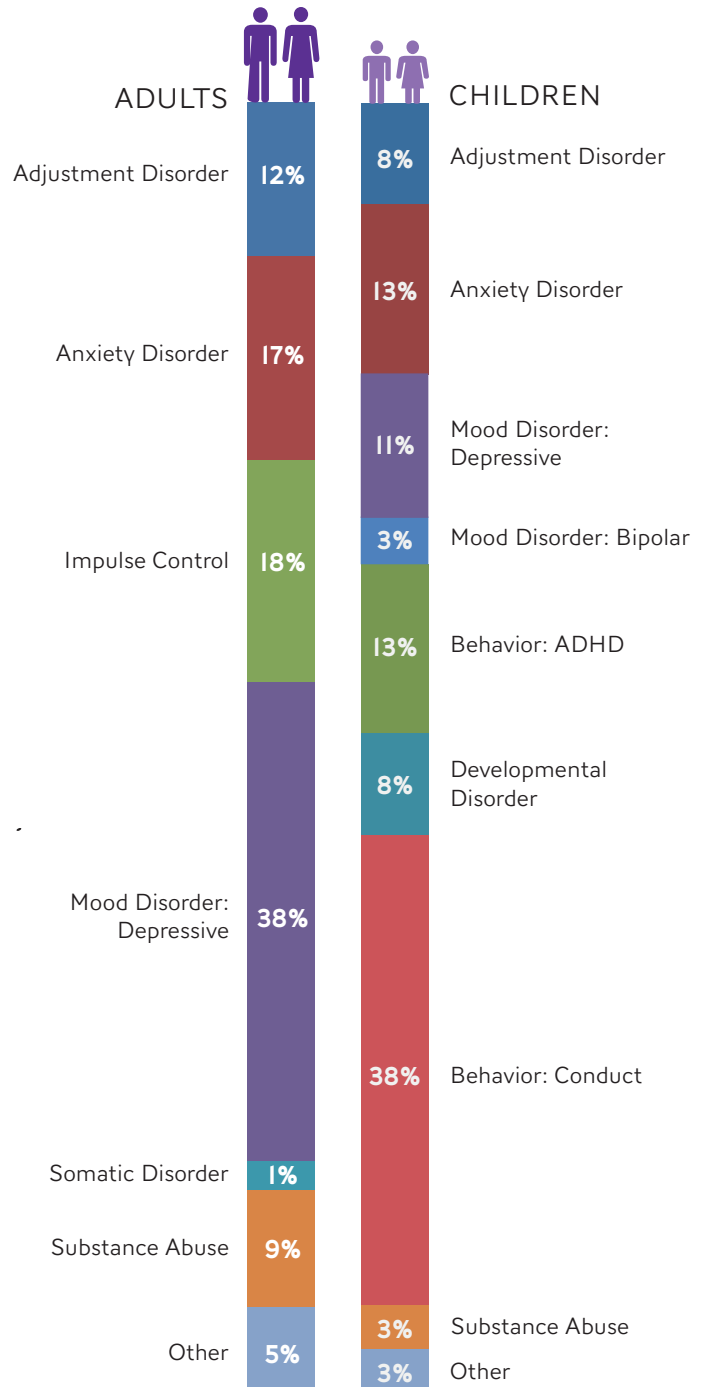

## PRIVATE CLIENTS PRESENTING PROBLEMS

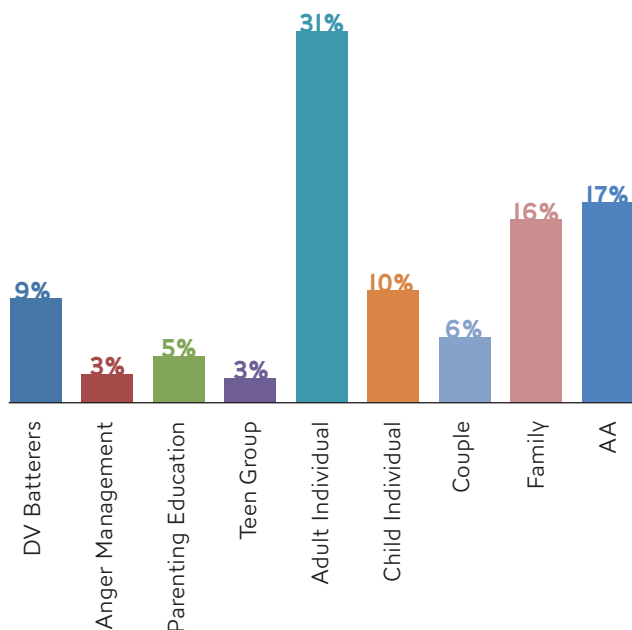


## PRIVATE CLIENTS MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES

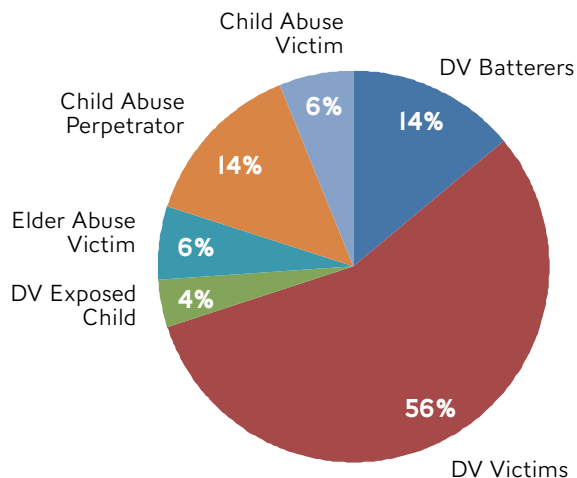

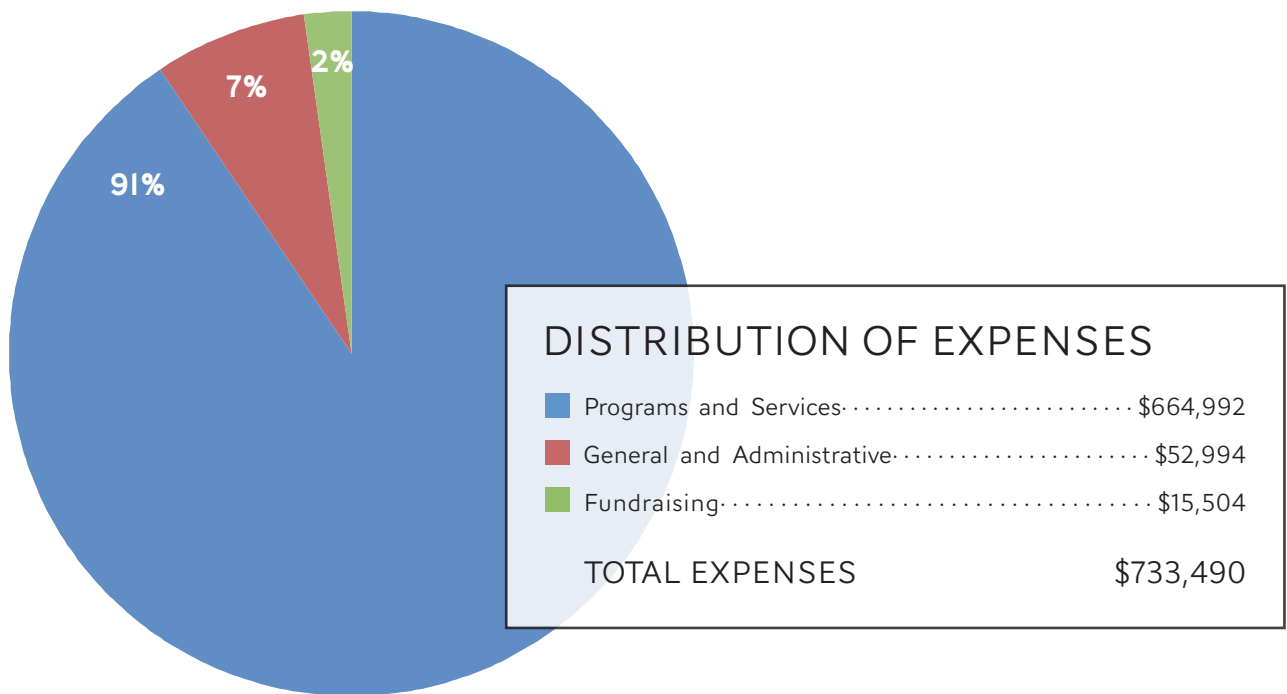
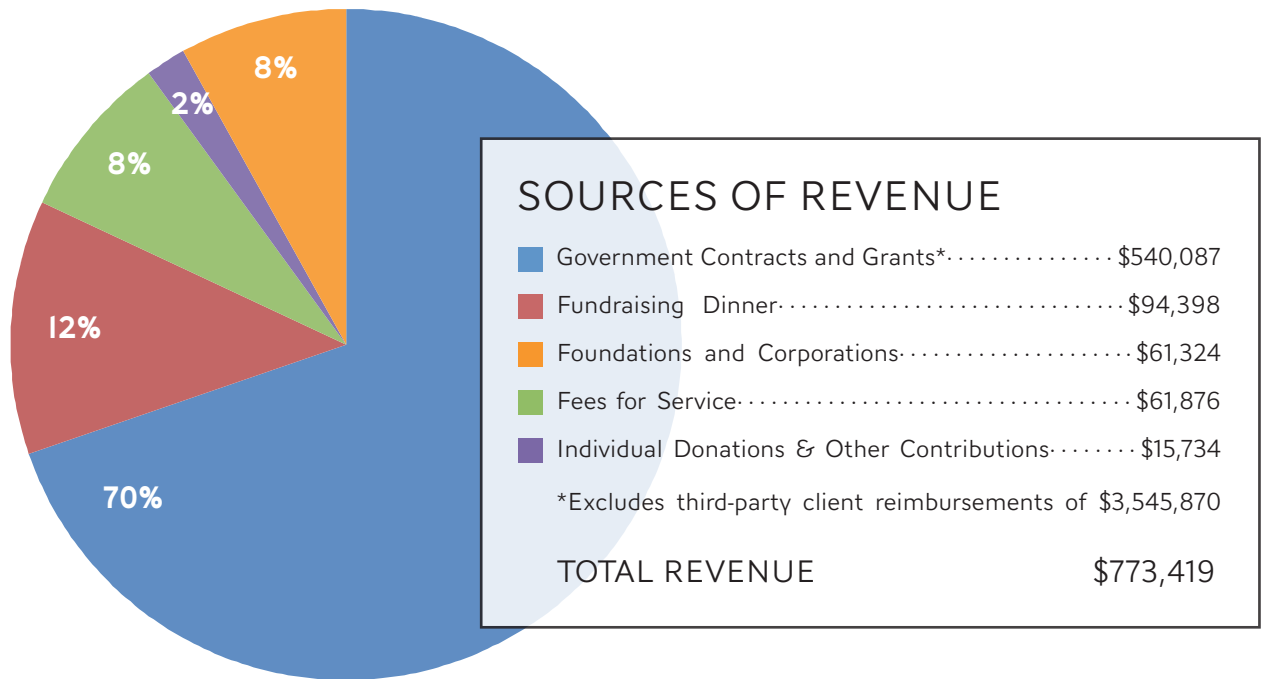
